## Dr. Bernard Noel Brady



Bernard "Barney" Noel Brady, MD, Honorable Consul General of Ireland died Friday, October 15, 2010 in Reno, Nevada. Services will be held 11:00 am Thursday, October 21, 2010 at Our lady of the Snows Catholic Church. Bernard was born in Bundoran, County Donegal, Ireland on December 23, 1941. He met and married the love of his life, Margaret in 1969. After graduating from the National University of Ireland in 1967 he went on to receive his Diploma in Anesthetics from the Royal College of Physicians in 1970, and became a member of the Royal College of Surgeons In Ireland Faculty of Anesthetists in 1974. The family immigrated to United States and settled in Reno in 1978 where he thrived in a rewarding and distinguished medical career. Dr. Brady joined Associated Anestheologist in 1978 and later became

President of the group. Dr. Brady achieved so much in his lifetime, his treasured accomplishments include his diplomatic appointment as Honorable Consul of Ireland in 1998, serving selflessly for many years; receiving the 2007 Adelante award from the Nevada Hispanic Services for his contributions to the Hispanic community; and his diplomatic service was once again rewarded with the highest honor bestowed, his appointment to Honorable Consul General of Ireland in 2008.

Bernard was also an avid, and gifted Gaelic football player having been the Captain of County Donegal, Captain of Ulster, and the Captain of combined University teams of Ireland. He was passionate about everything he did; he truly loved practicing medicine, being able to help others - putting his whole heart into those efforts. Barney was a great entertainer and orator of poetry, always willing to share his beloved poems, stories and music.

Bernard is survived by his wife, Margaret, whom he loved with all his heart, his two sons, Major Bernard Brady his spouse Meeja, Stuart Brady and his spouse Alanna, and three granddaughters, Keira Brady, Cristin Brady, and Shannon Brady. He will be forever missed by the family and friends who loved him, and the countless lives he touched.

May the sound of happy music, And the lilt of Irish laughter, fill your heart with gladness, that stays forever after.

Dec 23, 1941—Oct 15, 2010.</b></p> <p>Dr. Brady will be missed dearly by the Southern Nevada Sons of Erin, as Consul General, Dr. Brady's job was to foster trade and friendship between the United States and Ireland, this could be seen by his relationship with the Sons of Erin; his assistance and contributions to our organization will be hard to fill. We were always honored to have Dr. Brady present at our St. Patrick's Day Festival. Our thoughts and prayers are with his lovely wife, Marge and the rest of his family.</p> <p>Rest In Peace Dr. Brady.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Irish Barmbrack</b></p> <p>4 cups strong bread flour                  2 tablespoons butter or margarine                  ¼ cup caster, superfine sugar                  1 ½ teaspoons easy blend yeast                  ½ teaspoon ground ginger                  ¼ teaspoon freshly ground nutmeg                  1 cup sultanas (golden raisins)                  1 cup currants                  ¼ cup chopped mixed (candied) peel                  1 ¼ cup of warm strong tea</p> <p>Place the flour into a bowl and rub in the butter or margarine until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Stir in 5 ml/1 teaspoon of the sugar. Then add the yeast, ginger and nutmeg mix well. Stir in the sultanas, currants and mixed peel and make a well in the centre. Gradually work in enough of the warm tea to make a soft but not sticky dough. Knead well until the dough leaves the sides of the bowl clean. Knead on a lightly floured board for about 10 minutes until smooth and elastic. Place in an oiled bowl cover with Cling-film (plastic wrap) and leave to rise in a warm place for about an hour or until the dough has doubled in size, Knead again and then shape into a large round and place on a greased baking sheet. Cover and leave in a warm place or 30 minutes or until the dough has doubled in size. Shape into a greased and lined 900g/ 2lb loaf tin and bake in a pre-heated oven at 230°C/450°F gas mark 8 for 15 minutes then reduce the oven temperature to 200°C/400°F gas mark 6 for a further 20 minutes until well risen and golden and the loaf sounds hollow when tapped on the base. Dissolve the remaining sugar in 15ml/ 1 tablespoon of hot water and brush the syrup over the loaf and return to the oven for 2 minutes.</p> <p>Leave to cool then serve sliced with butter.</p>

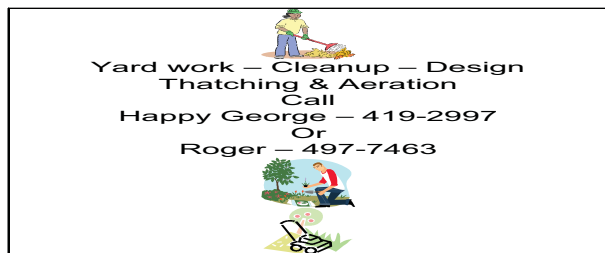
